Student Greenhouse

Three of our senior students, Clare Van Meter, Erin Pottschmidt, and Hannah Haverkos have spearheaded a project for OA's campus which will continue giving for years to come. Every senior is required to complete a semester-long internship or capstone project, and since all three of these ladies are planning to study architecture/design, they wanted to work together on a capstone project involving their passion. In August of 2022, they started brainstorming and thinking about what they could add to OA's campus and eventually landed on the idea to build a greenhouse. They spent the majority of their time last semester researching and learning about the construction process of greenhouses. In an effort to combine OA's values of the environment, art, and religion, they came up with a theme centered around St. Francis and the Care of Creation. They came up with a sketch and model of the greenhouse and went out to businesses in the community to get estimates for the supplies they would need. They also worked on writing grants to fund the project and with excitement received \$500 from the Ripley County Community Foundation's Greener Tomorrow Grant, and \$4,500 from the Rising Sun Regional Foundation, as well as funds from private donors.

Throughout this semester, they purchased materials and are currently working on building the greenhouse with the help of OA's Director of Maintenance, Ray Ronnebaum. With the frame built, the girls are preparing to paint it before adding the clear greenhouse siding. It should be completely finished by the end of the school year with the intent that next year, the greenhouse will be used in a multitude of classes including Biology, the new Horticulture class, and perhaps even culinary. Clare, Erin, and Hannah hope that current and future students will take advantage of the great hands-on learning opportunity that the greenhouse will provide. It's a wonderful legacy that these students can leave behind as seniors and look back on as they pursue careers in design.

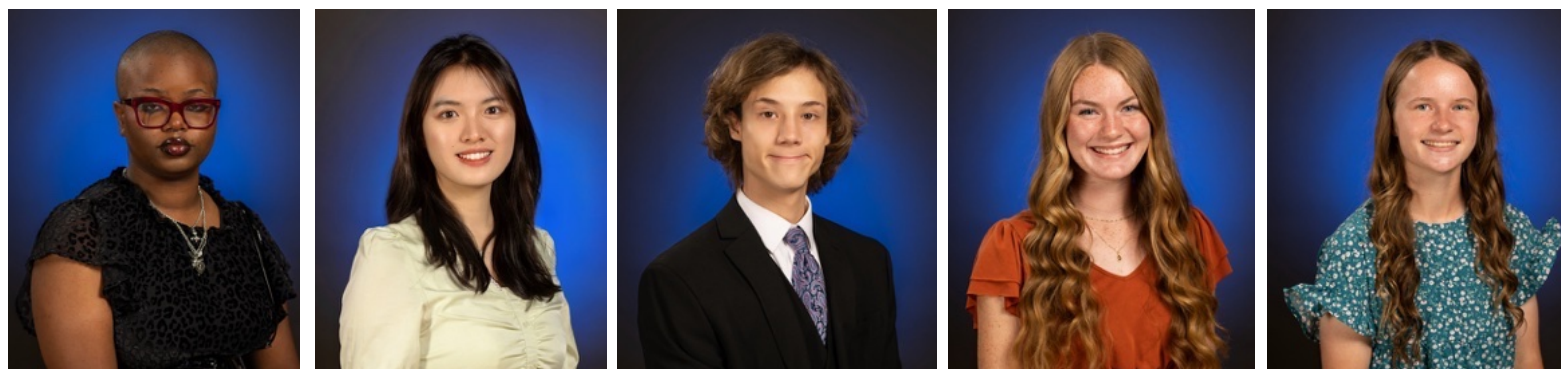
Archdiocese of Indianapolis Legacy Gala Auction

Oldenburg Academy's Student Media class took some major strides forward this year. While the class has a main focus of creating the OA yearbook, this year new media options were introduced. Student Media teacher, Mr. Walke received grant dollars from the Joan and John Hillenbrand VISION Fund and these dollars were used to convert an old office into a media studio. Having a dedicated studio space has allowed the class to create their own newscast program that is broadcast to students during Twister Time. Thanks to Batesville Area Arts Council funds, the class was able to have the 812's owner, Steven Harmeyer stop in and talk to students about how to create a professional news program. 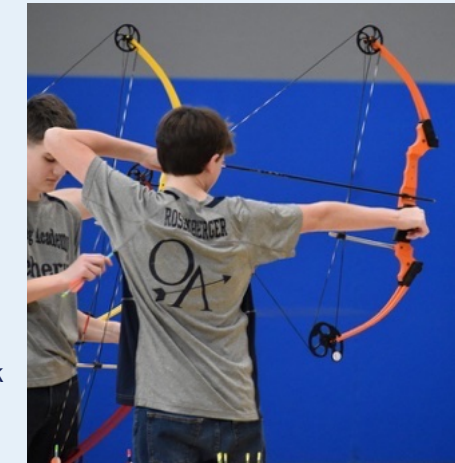
Pickleball Club

AP Environmental Studies and AP Biology Field Trip

This spring, the AP Environmental Science and AP Biology classes at Oldenburg Academy visited Greenacres Michaela Farm to learn about sustainable agriculture and soil health. The trip was an opportunity for students to personally observe the methods used by local farmers in growing nutritious food while minimizing the impact to our environment. During the trip, the students learned about the advantages of diversified farming, crop rotation, and cover crops, and they witnessed firsthand these practices' capacity for regenerating healthy soil. They also had the chance to hear about the farm's use of livestock waste, compost, and predatory insects as natural fertilizers and pesticides. Overall, the field trip was an eye-opening experience for the students, and it gave them a deeper appreciation for the vital role that sustainable agriculture plays in protecting our planet's resources.



Culinary Arts

The Culinary Arts class has continued to learn new cooking skills! Earlier in the semester, they took a field trip to JTM where they were able to cook alongside a trained chef from the Culinary Institute of America.

Spring Break Trip to Spain

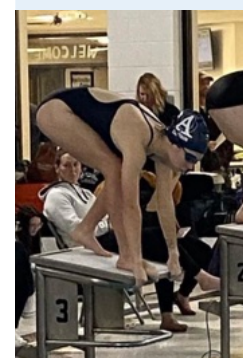
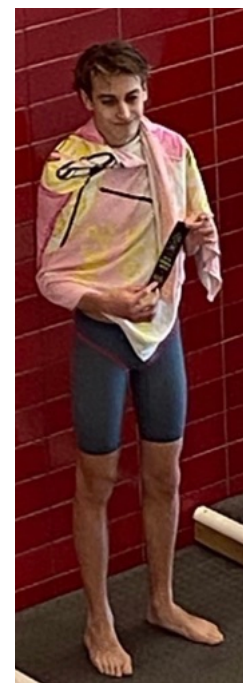
Girls Basketball
